

A guide for new members

We are always looking for new members to join Bromley Players. Our society's membership covers all ages (from 16 onwards) and we are always welcoming new talent. We do ask that all prospective new members audition for our society, however it's nothing to be nervous about and this guide will explain the process.

Step one: Introduce yourself

If you haven't already, then drop us a message online (via [Facebook](#) or [email](#)) and let us know you're interested. If we have upcoming new members' auditions we will send you the details and invite you along. If not then we will add you to our interest list and notify you when the next set of auditions are announced.

Step two: Audition

We hold two or three new members audition sessions every six months, usually in May and November. You can come on any date and don't need to book a specific time slot – just turn up! The process is quick and not meant to intimidate or scare you. You don't need to be the best singer or dancer, or have loads of experience, just relax and show us confidence in your performance.

The audition is in two parts:

1. **Movement audition** – in a group, you will be taught a very short routine on the night. It is designed to be simple enough for 'movers' but also allows dancers to show their skill. Please wear clothes that you are comfortable moving around in.
2. **Singing audition** – you will need to prepare a verse and chorus from a musical theatre song to perform alone in front of the committee. It can be any song (except for those in the upcoming show) so pick something that showcases your ability. We ask that you bring a recorded backing track (on your phone) or sheet music if we have a pianist available.

Step three: Membership

You will be contacted within 24 hours with the outcome of the audition. If you are invited to become a member then you will need to pay a £10 annual membership fee which allows you to audition for any show in the next year's season. You will also be sent a Welcome Pack with further details of our society and how it works. If you are not invited to become a member, we can provide feedback on request.
